Oil: In containers no larger than 5-gallons. Residential use only. **No antifreeze.**

Accepted only during operating hours: Spiral CFL bulbs; bikes; shredded paper; phones; rechargeable batteries and E-waste: (TV/DVD, computers, monitors, fax/copiers/printers, etc.)
Mandatory Recycling: TV's, computers/monitors

Minimum \$10 fee: up to 200 lbs household, 460 lbs demolition or 280 lbs mixed waste.

Inert Demolition Waste: \$34.50 per ton

Household Waste: \$84.55 per ton

Tire Recycling: \$157.95 per ton

Asbestos: \$167.50/ton—24-hour notice required

Fees are subject to change

Yard Waste: Branch limit to 4' x 6"

Free compost to Latah residents, when available.

Metal: All metals and large appliances.

Empire Service

Latah County is responsible for waste removal under state and federal regulations. The goal is to keep Latah County clean.

Solid Waste fees are mandatory for occupied homes in Latah County. Fees fund all waste disposal and recycling programs.



Latah County Solid Waste Ordinance:

Maintenance and operation of the rural solid waste collection system shall be funded by assessment and collection of a fee imposed upon all premises in Latah County, except those located within the corporate limits of any city.

Collection Service

Roll carts must be at the end of driveway by 5am. Waste must be bagged inside the roll cart to avoid littering and not packed too tightly to ensure complete removal. If roads are impassable extra waste will be collected the following, week free of charge.

Fees will be billed quarterly and must be paid no later than the 15th of March, June, September and December to avoid \$10.00 late fees. Fees for extras will be placed on the following quarters bill. Monthly automatic bank deductions can be set up for free. Credit/debit cards carry a 2.5% service fee (minimum \$1.50).

Unpaid fees are collected with property taxes. To stop billing exemption information and forms are available in the office or at www.latah.id.us/solidwaste.

Property owners are responsible for all fees and notifying tenants of programs.

Rural Recycling

Please use BOTH sides of the containers. Boxes are serviced when completely full, it is not cost effective to use a set schedule.

Potlatch City Hall parking lot

Rinse containers & discard all lids (unrecyclable)

Plastics: Must be at least 6 oz.

Jugs: such as milk, detergent, fabric softener

Jars: such as peanut butter

Bottles: such as water, soda, shampoo

Tubs: such as yogurt, butter, cottage cheese

Clamshells: such as deli/fresh produce

Metals: Aluminum or tin cans.

Glass: Bottles & jars ONLY.

Paper: Newspaper, dry food boxes, magazines/catalogs, (including glossy ads), telephone books, junk mail, cardboard, paper bags/sacks, gift wrap. Place loose in container, remove liners and flatten all boxes.

NOT ACCEPTED IN RURAL BOXES:
Pet food bags, plastic bags/wrap, plastic storage bins, planters/pots, plastic toys, aseptic (paper) cartons, foil or oil/hazardous waste containers.

310 tons of recycling was collected from the boxes in 2017 reducing the amount of waste shipped from the county and helping to keep costs down. Thank you to all who recycle!

Bulky Waste Program

Year round on specified Saturdays rural Latah County addresses have free disposal of 2-large appliances, 4-passenger vehicle tires (no rims), scrap metal and inert demolition waste items including large yard waste, furniture, mattresses, carpet, roofing, laminate flooring, brick, tile, concrete, drywall and untreated lumber.

During the clean up months of April & October sites **accept household waste** items including all plastic/rubber materials, insulation, styrofoam, small appliances and contaminated waste.

- No businesses or City of Moscow residents
- No hazardous or asbestos waste
- No E-waste (monitors & T.V's)
- Limit of 2-trips per household
- Extremely large loads must use the Transfer Station schedule
